San José Neighborhoods Commission: Structure

- Pilot Program completed: we're now an official, permanent commission
- Commissioners who served on the Pilot Program are "grandfathered in" for a transitional period (even if 3 in a district)
 - Those Districts with vacancies will have them filled by Council appointment.
 - New members were recruited in Sept. and are to be appointed in Jan.
 - No more "Alternates".
- Four-year terms, sync'd to Council calendar (i.e., terms expire in June).
 - Odd-numbered districts up for re-selection/replacement spring of 2014
 - Even-numbered districts will be selected by caucus in the spring of 2016.
- The caucus selection process similar to past
 - may be modified somewhat by the NC and approved by Council
 - Vacancies to be filled by Council appointment rather than special caucus.
 - City Clerk will develop New Member Orientation/Commissioner Training
 - o explaining Roberts Rules, Sunshine, etc.
- Clerk doesn't want Commissions to have a lot of subcommittees.


San José Neighborhoods Commission: Charter


- Neighborhood Quality of Life:
 - Neighborhood Safety: working with the Police Dept,
 Gang Task Force, etc.
 - Includes the Homeless
 - Transportation -- not explained: might include?:
 - bus/rail/BRT
 - bike routes/paths

- sidewalks? ped cut-throughs?
- o "complete streets", and maybe even traffic on Lincoln Ave...

CalTrain Los Gatos Crk Bridge Replacement

- Traffic, noise, and habitat impacts
- Draft IS/MND is being revised, followed by 20-day review & comment period.





WG Trestle Update

- City is proceeding apace with trestle replacement plans
- Initial Study / Mitigated Negative Declaration (IS/MND) due to be released for public comment this November
 - 30 day review period
- Idea: Think larger: recreate the LG Crk Streamside Park Cmte





History of the Los Gatos Creek Streamside Park Committee

- Originally founded in 1975 by County Supervisor Rod Diridon, championed by Jim Beall, and chaired by the late Don Hebard
- Officially under County Parks, with authority to interact with any agency: Cities, County, CalTrans, Water District, ...
 - But was only advisory: no budget for direct action
- Comprised of representatives from San José, Campbell, Los Gatos, SCVWD, and Santa Clara Co.
- the Committee faded into hiatus around 2000 when the remaining projects seemed to be all in San José

Time to recreate the Los Gatos Creek Committee

- What format? As a JPA (Joint Powers), Conservancy, or informal group?
- Add to its membership:
 - in addition to the above, add agencies? State, MidPen, and SC Co. Open Space?
 - non-profits? SJ Park Foundation, Guadalupe River Conservancy, Cmte for Green Foothills (CGF), Bay Area Ridge Trail, Silicon Valley Leadership Group?
- Add to its charter: work for health of the stream's habitat as well as for the recreational trail and the health of the community
- Empowered to receive and spend so that it can take action
- Together, it can do more than the individual agencies could do alone.
