



7:40 Trestle Update

- Council approved IS/MND & demolition plans
 - ignored public testimony on historic significance;
 - ruled that Council itself can decide what is historic
- Friends of WG Trestle working w/ preservationist attorney to assure compliance with State environmental law (CEQA)

MX/STING TREES



- City has formally approved demolition of the trestle
- Friends of WG Trestle are suing City to follow CEQA.




